Nepal Health Post Fundraiser

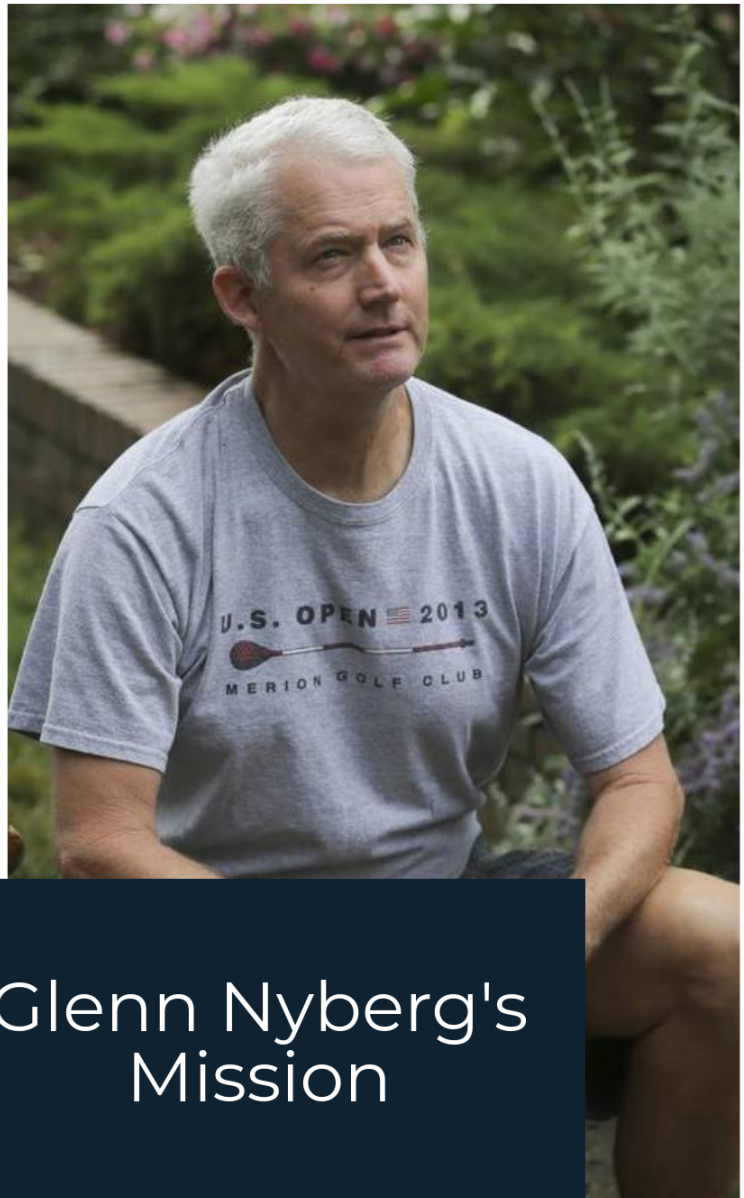
Liberty North High School's HOSA group is looking for sponsors to assist in our picnic fundraiser this spring.

Glenn's recent diagnosis with brain cancer has only amplified his humanitarian nature.

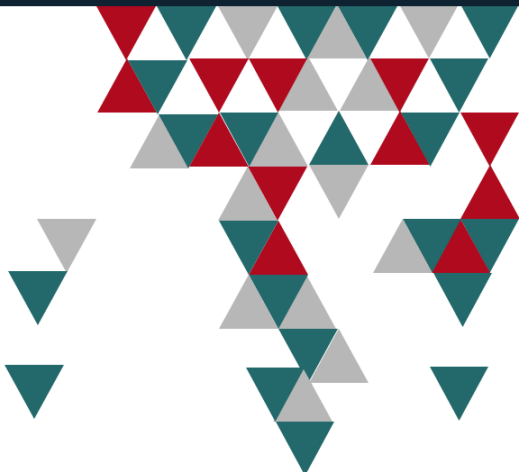

Glenn eventually found himself back home with his family, lucky to be alive. Nearly a year after his return a terrible earthquake hit Nepal and all those who helped save him. As a result, he set out to help rebuild the Village of Patle.

"The project in the Village of Patle involves building a Health Post, primary school, and secondary school. Initially, a budget was established to build the structures. Glenn's vision now includes taking it a step further by providing additional education for the nurses, salaries for teachers who speak English, and introducing technology in the classroom. As I mentioned, the Health Post is almost complete and there is talk now that this may be considered a regional hospital."
